- Compare: to point out/show the similarities between two things
- Contrast: to point out/show the differences between two things.

You are to write in the Block Format.

- What did the character learn? grow? Give evidence.
- How does the character feel about nature? Give evidence.
- How is this character different from their sibling? Evidence.

- What did the character learn? grow? Give evidence.
- How does the character feel about nature? Give evidence.
- How is this character different from their sibling? Evidence.

Paragraph #4: Provide a few sentences to close up your discussion.
